From Pastor Scales



It is May and I am waiting for it to be warm, at least warmer than what it has been. It will eventually, and I will never complain about how hot it is. it. Growing up in Oklahoma, I know hot weather. But once again, I cannot help but think of the wonders of God. Some say they do not believe in God. So, how do we have weather? How do we have plants? How do we have animals? How do we have each other? How do we have love? Where did all of that come from?

Sometimes, it is almost too much to think about, what all God has provided us. We do not exist in isolation from creation and our creator. Creation just keeps going and creating. We are not in charge. We can cause adaptations and we can adapt, but we cannot create.


