I am amazed by all the lights in front of the houses or in the front yards. They remind me that Jesus came as a light into the dark world. It reminds me that Christmas is much more than presents. It reminds me that Christmas is love. And God shows his light and love in so many ways; with the lights at the houses, or in the love of a father to his children providing a special Christmas. As we are in the middle of the dark season, let us remember that Jesus Christ was born to bring light into our dark.
