Kornelius and the Chocolate Easter Bunny

Some people take Lent extremely seriously. I first became aware of this when I was at elementary school and attended a Catholic youth group. In the youth group, shortly before Lent started, we made little cardboard savings boxes in which we were supposed to put our money that we wouldn't spend on sweets during Lent. At the end of Lent, we were supposed to donate it to a non-profit organization. As it was often the case, at the time I was told that this was a Catholic tradition and we did not practice it as Lutherans. It wasn't until a few years later, after I met Kornelius, that I learned that there are Lutheran Christians who also observe Lent.

Kornelius told me that a few years before we met, he took fasting very seriously and had decided to give up sugar completely for the entire fasting period. After all, it is supposed to be healthy and certainly does no harm. As a determined person, Kornelius set himself this goal and followed through. Or maybe not? It was easy for him at first. But the longer the fasting period went on, the harder it became for him. Especially because that chocolate Easter bunny of the "Kinder" brand kept looking at him. One day he could no longer control himself and greedily bit into the delicious chocolate. Frustrated that he couldn't hold out, he spoke to a friend who is a Catholic priest. He then explained to him that Lent excludes Sundays. So you are supposed to fast from Monday to Saturday, but not on Sundays. The priest explained that Lent has 40 (fasting) days plus Sundays. To be able to resist these cravings. Because God only burdens us with as much as we can bear. Lent does not mean giving up everything, but it gives us time to become aware of what is really important to us in life. It gives us time to spend with God.

Eternal Flame is \$10.


