
Pastor Scales

Remembering 9-11-2001

My daughter Christine was expecting her first baby in about four months. (Turned out she was going to have a girl named Abby.) Christine wanted to go on a trip before she would give birth. We chose a cruise to Alaska and went through a travel agent and were going to go in late September, on the Holland American ship the Volendam. Received a good deal. However the ship's company would not take mothers who were too far along in their pregnancies and Christine fell in that category. We were notified we could go a few weeks earlier on September 10 for an extra \$100.

September 10th we went to O'Hare airport and boarded our Canadian Airline plane to Vancouver B.C. where the ship was docked. The first morning we arose a little early because of the three-hour difference from Chicago time. We turned on the television and saw the horrible news. Watched for awhile and saw one of the Towers collapse and said, "Oh My GOD". The sunken lounge had a big television which kept showing the news and each time we passed we would pause for a few minutes. The ship offered a Christian service to remember the tragedy and pray for the victims and responders.

The ship continued on its cruise. The first day was the inside passage, then stops at Juneau, Skagway, cruised Glacier Bay, and last Ketchikan. Then back to Vancouver B.C. via the inside passage.

We enjoyed the cruise as best we could under the circumstances knowing what was happening across the United States. We wondered how or when we would get home since many airports were closed and planes were not flying all week.

Before leaving the ship on September 17, everyone was informed if their flight was more than two hours away to go to a hotel and not the airport. Our flight was in about two hours, so we joined the long line at the airport. After a long hour and a half we did not get very far. God answered our prayers and was good to us. Our names were called, and we were taken out of line to board the waiting Canadian airliner. I believe we were the last ones to board and did not get our original assigned seats but each of us had an aisle seat across from each other toward the back of the plane. We received a meal on our flight back to O'Hare Airport. Eugene and Andy were waiting for us in the huge empty airport, it seemed unreal. We thanked the Lord that we were safely back home in Indiana.

As to the baby girl, she now attends Valparaiso University on a scholarship. In a way, we are three generations: unborn daughter, mother and grandmother.
