From Pastor Scales

Those of you over 65 know that our health care provider is to have a "wellness check" with us each year, promoted and financed by Medicare. I recently had mine and all went well. Then my health care provided looked at me straight in the eye and said, "How are you emotionally." Normally, I would say, "ok". This time I stammered a bit. The world is not ok, so how can I be ok. I admitted I have felt some things emotionally that I don't ever remember feeling before. I told her that I finally identified what I had been feeling as anxiety. Something is just not right in the world and that affects me, and we know it must affect others as well.

My anxiety is not overwhelming. It is just an emotion that I have not had very much. My health care provider assured me that she is hearing this a lot and each person is different and works with their anxieties in various and different ways.

The way in which I primarily deal with being anxious is through prayer, usually short sentence prayers asking for calmness. I know of many who find help through someone else, a friend, a doctor, a therapist. I know now, I can reach out to my health care provider if needed. We find ourselves reaching out of ourselves when we find turmoil within ourselves.

And of course, that reminds me of how blessed I am, and we all are, to have each other within a community of God's love, compassion and strength.

Season of Creation 2020, a series of weekly devotions for Sept. 1-Oct. 4, is now available! The season, which begins with the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, is a time to join with the global Christian community in renewing, repairing and restoring commitments to God, to one another and to all creation. For the four churches that prepared the resource — the ELCA, The Episcopal Church, the Anglican Church of Canada and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada — this is also a time for strengthening relationships with one another. Through Scripture, hymns, advocacy and action, these weekly devotions, which begin Sept. 6, invite people to live out their vocations as stewards of creation.

No New changes to in-person worship service.

GLC Leadership continues to monitor COVID-19 in our state and across the nation. We are receiving guidance and input from ELCA leadership, Federal/State agencies, and local updates. Service restrictions and precautions needed for in-person worship services are described below. These precautions are considered necessary given our understanding of the risks associated with COVID-19 exposure.

In-person Worship:

Only one entrance – the West entrance at the parking lot – will be used for entry to the worship service. The door attendant will take individuals temperatures as they enter the building as well as hand out masks and/or gloves to anyone attending that may need them. **NOTE:** Masks are required. Gloves are optional. Signs or floor markings will be put down to provide visual references of the 6' distance requirement.

Singing during services:

The guidelines state that singing should be prohibited for the time being, even when wearing face coverings. 2-3 members assisting in leading the worship service will sing during the service. The congregation in attendance, seated in the pews are discouraged from singing even with their masks on.

Hymnals, cushions, other items kept in pews have been removed:

The sanctuary has been stripped of all written materials and cushions to better protect our members and to facilitate the cleaning process. A deep cleaning of the Entry Hall, Narthex, Sanctuary and Restroom areas will be done weekly.

Paper Bulletins:

Bulletins will be printed and placed on tables with the all-in-one communion cups and offering plates. These tables will also have hand sanitizer stations on them.

Seating arrangements:

There will be markings and signs identifying seating that will be used for services, and to prevent members from sitting in pews designated to remain empty for physical distancing requirements. The Ushers will coordinate seating and limit gathering in the Narthex both before and after service and will also be wearing face masks. After Communion, the Ushers will proceed down the aisles with bowls for members to discard their used communion cups.

When the service has concluded the Ushers will direct the exodus from church starting with members seated in back while maintaining the appropriate physical distancing.
